Federal Student Aid Programs

Your application was selected for review in a process called Verification. During this process, St. Joseph's University will be comparing information from your FAFSA application with copies of your and/or your parent(s) 2022 Federal tax transcripts, W-2 forms, and possibly other necessary financial documents. The law specifies we reserve the right to request this information before awarding any Federal or Institutional funds. If there are any discrepancies found between your FAFSA application information and your financial documents, your FAFSA may need to be corrected.

Submit this information to the Office of Financial Aid **immediately**, as we will not typically award Federal and/or institutional awards until this process is complete. Failure to complete verification in a timely manner may lead to cancellation of aid. Should additional information be required, the Office of Financial Aid will contact you. You will be notified if FAFSA corrections result in changes/cancellation of award(s).

Important Note: The instructions below apply to each parent included in the household. Notify the financial aid office if the parents filed separate IRS income tax returns for 2022 or had a change in marital status after December 31, 2022.

Instructions: Complete this section if the parents filed or will file a 2022 IRS income tax return(s). As part of federal student aid eligibility, parents will be required to consent and approve sharing and importing income and tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA form, even if the attempt to obtain or use such data is ineffective. In other words, if the parents filed separate 2022 IRS income tax returns, both must provide consent and approval to share and import income and tax information from the IRS. In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2022 income information that was transferred into the student's FAFSA using income and tax information directly from the IRS.

If 2022 income tax return information for the parents was not available or could not be used, the parents should provide the institution with a **2022 IRS Tax Return Transcript(s) or a signed copy of the 2022 income tax return and applicable schedules.**

A **2022 IRS Tax Return Transcript** may be obtained through:

- **Get Transcript by Mail** – Go to www.irs.gov, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript by Mail." Make sure to request the "Return Transcript" and **NOT** the "Account Transcript." The transcript is generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the online request.
- **Get Transcript Online** – Go to www.irs.gov, click "Get Your Tax Record." Click "Get Transcript Online." Make sure to request the "Return Transcript" and **NOT** the "Account Transcript." To use the Get Transcript Online tool, the user must have (1) access to a valid email address, (2) a text-enabled mobile phone (pay-as-you-go plans cannot be used) in the user's name, and (3) specific financial account numbers (such as a credit card number or an account number for a home mortgage or auto loan). The transcript displays online upon successful completion of the IRS's two-step authentication.
- **Automated Telephone Request** – 1-800-908-9946. Transcript is generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the telephone request.
- **Paper Request Form** – IRS Form 4506T-EZ or IRS Form 4506-T. The transcript is generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the paper request form.
- Parent Non Tax Filers must submit 2021 IRS Verification of Non-filing letter to the Office of Financial Aid. If you have never filed a tax return in any year, please use the third option, completing IRS form 4506T-EZ. When submitting verification of non-filing letter be sure to write student ID# on letter and indicate that it is for the parent.
 - **You can obtain the 2022 IRS Verification of Non-filing letter by either: going to www.irs.gov.** Click "Get Transcript Online" then select "Verification of Non-filing letter", by calling 1-800-908-9946, or by completing IRS form 4506T-EZ.
