E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

- 1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:*
When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by a representative from each institution.
- 2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*
Each semester St. Joseph's College will provide the BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
- 3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:*
This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and St. Joseph's College website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

F. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (E.G., FINANCIAL AID, TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS)

Students who demonstrate financial need, special interest and/or academic promise may be considered for additional grants. Award amounts vary according to financial need and available funds. St. Joseph's College offers transfer scholarships for students who have completed 24 or more credits:

2.8 to 2.99 GPA: \$7,000

3.0 to 3.39: \$9,000

3.4 to 3.69: \$10,000

3.7 to 4.0: \$12,000

Also, if a student belongs to the Phi Theta Kappa National Honor Society, St. Joseph's College awards the \$1000 PTK Award. St. Joseph's College also will award this amount to a student who belongs to BMCC's honor society.
